Cultivating Future Leaders: JEEVIKA's In-Depth Training on CBO Processes and Quality Management



JEEVIKA has organized a three-day intensive training program aimed at enhancing the skills and knowledge of young professionals in Community-Based Organization (CBO) processes and quality enhancement. Held from May 20 to May 22, 2024, at S.D Vatika Palace in Patna, the program brought together passionate young professionals dedicated to fostering rural development through effective Self-Help Groups

(SHGs) and SHG federations.

The training program was meticulously designed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of SHG federations, their structures, governance, and critical roles in rural development. By combining theoretical knowledge with practical skills, the program aimed to empower young professionals to drive meaningful change at the grassroots level. Program Outline and Methodology

The program adopted a participatory and interactive approach, employing various learning methods such as lectures, group discussions, case studies, role plays, video presentations, and practical exercises. This diverse mix of methodologies catered to different learning preferences, ensuring a holistic understanding of the topics covered.

Day 1: Overview and SHG Federation Movement

The first day began with a detailed outline of the program, followed by pair introductions and brief self-introductions by participants, fostering a collaborative environment. This initial session was essential for setting the stage for interactive discussions and knowledge sharing throughout the program. Participants had the opportunity to express their expectations and objectives, which helped tailor the sessions to address their specific needs.

The morning session focused on the historical evolution of the SHG movement in India, with insights into key initiatives such as the Integrated Rural Development Program (IRDP), Swarnjayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana (SGSY), National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM), and models developed by DHAN Foundation and MYRADA. This session highlighted the significant milestones and challenges encountered in the SHG movement, providing a comprehensive background for participants to understand the current landscape.

Session followed by High-Tea, allowing participants to network and exchange initial thoughts. These informal interactions were crucial for building rapport among participants, facilitating better communication and collaboration during subsequent sessions. The next session delved into the necessity of forming SHG federations. Participants discussed the various benefits of federating SHGs, such as increased bargaining power, better access to credit and resources, and enhanced capacity for advocacy. The session included the screening of "Hath se Hath Milao," a movie that vividly illustrated the impact and importance of federations in promoting collective action and empowerment.

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Afternoon Session: Orissa Case Study Discussion

The afternoon session included a group discussion on a case study from Orissa. This case study provided practical insights into the challenges and benefits of SHG federations, highlighting real-world applications of the concepts discussed earlier. Participants engaged in lively discussions, sharing their perspectives and learning from each other's experiences.

The day concluded with an interactive session focusing on the benefits of SHG federations, particularly the roles of Village



Organizations (VO) and Cluster Level Federations (CLF). Participants discussed how these federations can enhance the effectiveness of individual SHGs by providing support structures and facilitating resource sharing.

Day 2: Governance and Leadership in CBOs

The second day commenced with a recap of the previous day's discussions. Participants presented their insights and reflections, reinforcing their understanding of the topics covered. This recap session was crucial for ensuring continuity and clarity, helping participants build on their knowledge from the previous day.

The main focus of the day was on the structure, governance, and leadership rotation within CBOs. Participants delved into the formation and functioning of General Bodies (GB), Representative General Bodies (RGB), and Boards of Directors (BoD) at the VO and CLF levels. Discussions covered topics such as tenure, reservation, rotation of leaders, membership, share capital, and the processes for leader rotation. Practical exercises and role plays were conducted to help participants internalize these concepts, providing hands-on experience in implementing governance structures.

The next session explored governance practices and the importance of registration. Participants learned about statutory norms and the steps involved in registering CBOs, including the legal requirements and documentation needed. This session emphasized the significance of good governance practices in ensuring transparency, accountability, and sustainability of SHG federations.

The afternoon session included practical exercises and video clips to enhance understanding and engagement. Participants worked in small groups to discuss governance challenges and develop solutions, applying the concepts learned in the morning sessions. These exercises fostered teamwork and critical thinking, helping participants develop practical skills for effective governance.

Day 3: Good Governance and Cadre Management

The final day started with a recap of the previous day's topics, followed by presentations to ensure clarity and retention. Participants reviewed key points and shared their takeaways, reinforcing their understanding of governance and leadership rotation.
